



We are thrilled to announce that Genevieve Crouch of K-State Research & Extension Sedgwick County has earned top honors in the Kansas 4-H State Project Awards for her work in the Geology project area. Through this achievement, she has earned eligibility to attend the national level event, National 4-H Congress, set for November 28–December 2.

Record Book & Project Achievement

Genevieve's journey began at the county and regional levels: she compiled her 4-H project record book, documented her learning in geology, and fulfilled leadership and service components required by the Kansas 4-H Youth Development program. Officials emphasized that state award winners demonstrate not only project skill but also leadership, organization, and civic-engagement growth.

At the state-level evaluation, only one winner is selected per project category in the senior division (ages 14-18), after thorough evaluation of report forms, progress summaries, and impact. Genevieve secured the State Geology award for Kansas.

What Record Book Recognition Means

This honor is a strong affirmation of Genevieve's dedication to her project work, her growth as a youth leader, and her contributions to 4-H in Sedgwick County. Congratulations are due to her, her club, her family, her mentors, and the Extension team who supported her.

From Nov 28 to Dec 2, Genevieve will join a select delegation of youth across the United States for the National 4-H Congress. This event brings together youth leaders, workshops, service-learning projects, national speakers, and peer networking opportunities. While specific agenda details for her trip may still be finalized, participants typically engage in:

- Project demonstrations and peer-sharing sessions
- Service learning and civic engagement activities
- Recognition events and award celebrations
- Inspiring keynote addresses and leadership training
- Cultural and social activities to connect across states

We in Sedgwick County couldn't be any more proud of Genevieve's accomplishment. It illustrates the tremendous opportunity 4-H offers: not just project work, but growth of leadership, service, and personal development. Her success shines bright lights on our 4-H youth, club leaders, volunteers, and extension professionals.

YQCA CERTIFICATE IS MANDATORY FOR SEDGWICK COUNTY YOUTH TO SHOW AT SEDGWICK COUNTY FAIR

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) is a national multi-species quality assurance program for youth ages 8 to 21. The program is designed to provide a minimum 60 minutes of education each year.

YQCA is the result of a collaborative effort between states that have previously offered multi-species youth livestock quality assurance programs, the National Pork Board's Youth PQA Plus program and representatives from other national livestock groups.

Food Safety

YQCA is designed as an annual education and certification program focused on food safety, animal well-being and character awareness for youth ages 8 to 21 producing and/or showing pigs, beef cattle, dairy cattle, sheep, goats, rabbits, and poultry.

Animal Well Being

The program has been designed by extension specialists and national livestock program managers to ensure it is accurate, current and relevant to the needs of the animal industry and shows and is appropriate for youth.

 Character Development YQCA is accepted at a number of shows across the United States.
