# COUNTY AND STATE FAIR GUIDELINES FOR FROSTINGS – FILLINGS AND ARTS AND CRAFTS

### Safety of Frostings and Fillings

Last year, we completed a study on the safety of frostings and fillings for foods. We tested almost 50 recipes to get a broader picture of the science behind these recipes. This study was not done to provide recipes.

Please review this publication and share with your food judges, foods leaders, 4-H members and others. You will see that we are not changing any of the guidelines that we have had in place the last few years. Now we have data to back this up. We have provided a simple guideline to check recipes and they must show it has more than 65% sugar to meet safety guidelines. This will be the responsibility of those who prepare the food to insure it meets these calculations. Judges will not have time to calculate this during the judging time.

For food safety purposes, any food with custard and dairy-based fillings and frostings (ex. Cream cheese) raw eggs, flavored oils, "canned" bread or cakes in a jar, cut fresh fruit or any food requiring refrigeration (ex. Bacon) or unbaked exhibit with raw flour (ex. No bake cookies) will be disqualified and not judged. Alcohol (ex. Wine, beer and hard liquor) is not allowed as an ingredient in food entries. Entries with alcohol will be disqualified.

#### Ages 7-8

#### **Class 1 Fine Arts**

(Oil, chalk, charcoal, dyes, pastels, pencil, ink. Acrylic, or watercolor on canvas, canvas board, paper, wood, metal, or textiles, framed as a picture, prepared for hanging. Stretched canvas art on a wooden frame is considered prepared for hanging provided that frame has a hanger.

#### **Class 2 Clay and Ceramics**

(Any original item made of clay; may be fired or unfired, hand formed or thrown on a wheel. Self-hardening, fire/oven/cured, and/or cornstarch clays are acceptable. Items can include, but are not limited to, clay statues, bowls, etc.

#### Class 3 Leather and Jewelry

(Any leather stamping, carving, tooling, lacing, or stitching piece or any jewelry piece made from any medium are acceptable exhibits.

#### Class 4 Three-Dimensional

(The piece must be observable on at least three sides and should be either free-standing or prepared to be hung. Craft and pre-formed or assembled projects are not acceptable.

#### **Class 5 General Crafts**

(This category incorporates miscellaneous pieces that do not correspond to the four, above-mentioned categories.

#### Ages 9-13

#### **Class 6 Fine Arts**

## YOUTH FOR THE QUALITY CARE OF ANIMALS

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) is a new, national, multi-species youth livestock quality assurance program that covers food safety, animal well-being, and character development through age-appropriate educational curriculum.

#### YQCA is not required to show at the 2021 Sedgwick County Fair.

Any youth 7 years of age and older who will be exhibiting a market or breeding animal in the Kansas State Fair Grand Drive or Kansas Junior Livestock Show (KJLS) is required to obtain certification. YQCA certification number will be submitted through the nomination process for market animals, and at the time of entry for exhibitors who only have registered purebred breeding animals. All youth should complete the training by June 15, 2021.

**7-Year-Old YQCA** – The YQCA Board has provided an option for Kansas 7-year-olds to become officially certified. The state communication is that they must attend an instructor-led class with a parent/legal guardian. However- Sedgwick County will not be offering in person training this year- as I have not been trained to conduct this program at this time. Below is the certification process our county will follow for 7 year old certifications:

- 7-year-olds have permission to take the currently available 8-year-old web-based course through the YQCA website as an online option.
- They will register and complete the class, like any other web-based course and receive a certificate.
- They will not be able to re-certify online next year when they are a true 8-year-old, until their current certification expires.
- o If they chose to do the class online as an 8-year-old next year, that's fine, they'll just have to wait until their 2021 certificate expires. The system will try to "help them out" and not let them re-enroll in a class they've already taken.
- Example: If they complete the class on March 31 this year, they won't be able to recertify until April 1, 2022. At that point, the system will let them in and select the 8-year-old course.
- To clarify- your 7 year old will take the age 8 class twice (This year while they are 7and next year when they are 8). They should NOT continue taking the course for the next age up in the future. We don't want them to be off track for their entire show career.

### LIVESTOCK TAGGING INFORMATION

This year as we transition back to in person events Sedgwick County will be using a self-tagging system. Steps for purchasing tags, tagging, and providing proof of tagged animal is as follows:

1. Tags will be available to purchase at the Extension Office now and will be available until ONE WEEK before nominations and/or Pre-entries are due for specific species. This is to allow time for you to tag your animal, provide proof of tagging, and complete any pre-entry or nomination process. EID Tags are \$3.50, 4-H Tags are \$1.50, and DNA Envelopes are \$.50. Please bring cash or check to purchase.

Deadlines for Nominations/ Pre Entries are as follows:

- May 1: Market Beef (KSF, KJLS) This is a Saturday, so plan accordingly
- o Tags Available to purchase until April 23rd
- June 15: Sheep, Goat, Swine, and Commercial Heifer (KSF, KJLS)
- o Tags Available to purchase until June 8th
- May 28: County Fair Pre-entry of all Species due
- o Tags Available to purchase until May 21st
- 2. Tagging photo evidence has been deemed a best practice by the state during this time. We are requiring any 4-Hers with self-tagged animals to email photographic proof to snbiery@gmail.com with the subject line reading: Self Tagging Evidence (4her Name) (Photo Evidence is not required for animals tagged at Beef, Sheep, or Goat Weigh-In) Photo Evidence Includes:
- Photo of animal and exhibitor
- Photos of animal from multiple angles
- Photo of tag in animals ear by which the tag number can easily be read

## KS JUNIOR LIVESTOCK & KS STATE FAIR

4-H members planning on showing their animals at the Kansas Junior Livestock Show (KJLS) and/or the Kansas State Fair must submit nominations to the Youth Livestock office. Market Beef nominations are due by May 1. \*\*NOTE: Please plan ahead as May 1 is a Saturday this year, so all forms will need to be signed no later than Friday, April 30. Commercial Heifer, Swine, Sheep, and Meat Goat nominations are due by June 15. ### HORSE ID AND HORSELESS HORSE CERTIFICATE

All Horse Identification Certificates and Horseless Horse Certificates are due to the Extension office by 5 p.m. on Friday, **April 30** because May 1 falls on a Saturday this year. \*\*Please note that the Horse ID Certificate was updated last year and this form (dated January 2020) must be used. Also posted on the website above is an example of a correctly filled out Horse ID Certificate; it must only be one page (front and back).

4-H Horse Snaffle Bit Project Nominations - Horse snaffle bit project nominations are also due to the Extension office by 5 p.m. on Friday, **April 30** since May 1 falls on a Saturday this year.

Along with the nomination, a Horse Identification Certificate and a \$10 fee must be submitted.

Achievement Level 1 must be completed by the District Show registration deadline. The Level Testing exams are available by contacting Nicole (snbiery@ksu.edu). These links will not be released directly to families. Exam links will be sent upon request. Please be reminded of the 4-H Code of Ethics when you log into the exam. These links are being kept password protected so that the Agent is aware of every youth working through the certification process.

#### General

- o All components of levels testing were moved to an online format last year.
- o The \$10 fee (\$5 for exam and \$5 for riding) will still apply. This should be submitted with the signed coversheet upon the successful completion of the online test.
  - ☐ The fee is the family's responsibility, and any checks need to be made payable to the Kansas 4-H Foundation.
  - □ Digital signatures are acceptable.
- o Youth are able to complete multiple levels in a year, but they must be done in order.

#### Exam

- o Exams I-III are available via Qualtrics.
- o Each exam has 50 questions.
- o Each exam must be completed in one sitting.
- o 70% is required to pass all exams.
- o The score is visible at the conclusion of the exam.
- An automated confirmation email with final score will also be sent to the email address entered at the beginning of the exam.
- Each youth should forward this email to their Agent to confirm exam completion.
- o Youth will not be able to review their exam.
- Response reports will not be available to youth, however, an Agent may request a response report from Shannon Rogge (luckiksu@ksu.edu) if:
  - the youth did not pass the Level testing
     the agent is providing appropriate study materials in correlation with missed responses
     please allow 72 business hours to receive response report

Please note:

• Level IV: no exam, oral question/answers only with the evaluator

#### Skills (Riding/Groundwork)

- o Groundwork/riding portion of levels testing will be completed via video conferencing (Zoom, Facetime, etc.) or with a recorded video.
- o The spreadsheet is available at https://www.kansas4h.org/projects/animals/horse.html beneath project materials. This is an updated list for evaluators who have agreed to score by video conferencing.
- The evaluators will send the completed scoresheets directly to the state office.

State 4-H Horse Show entries will be completed in ShoWorks, managed by Jenn Galloway KSF, again this year. Youth will self-select which District they are utilizing for their qualifying classes.

- The Kansas 4-H State Fair Rulebook horse division will be updated to reflect these changes
- Electrical hookups and stalls will open through ShoWorks on May 3rd. These are sold by the Kansas State Fair on a first come-first serve basis and are nonrefundable.
  - o Families will be able to purchase stalls before Districts, however if they do not qualify they will forfeit their stalls and all monies.
  - o After District qualifying classes are known, families can log back into their account to purchase classes and wristbands.

- Entries are due August 1 online.
- District qualified horses may only be entered and shown in the same class at the State 4-H Horse Show, no substitutions.
- More details about check-in times, including vet checks, will be announced this summer through collaboration with Kansas State Fair.
