Oz-Some Camp returns in 2021!

Oz-Some Camp Group is excited to announce that camp will be held at Rock Springs 4-H Camp this summer June 24-27. Registration will open April 15th at 6:00 AM and will close on April 30th at 11:59 PM. We anticipate that camp will fill up quickly -- so make a plan to reserve your spot. Registration is first come first served. You may use the registration link: <u>https://tinyurl.com/20214HCamp</u> to register. Once registration opens, the link will direct you to fill out the registration information and pay or be placed on a waiting list if the registration capacity is already full. <u>It is important that you note that your spot will not be</u> <u>reserved until you have paid.</u> Camp fee is \$250 before local scholarships. A linited number of \$50 scholarships are available to youth registering for camp. As you go into the registration form you will be directed to a Google Doc where the camper will be asked to draft a paragraph indicating what the camp experience means to them. Upon completing the Google Doc you will automatically receive a coupon code to input in the registration form which should be open in a separate tab on your web browser. After inputting that code you will be registered with that \$50 scholarship deducted if the number of scholarships recipients has not already been exhausted at the time of your registration.

Camp will look a bit different this year to allow adherence to COVID-19 protocols. Below are some of the changes and precautions that will be taken. Please take these into consideration as you decide if camp is right for your 4-H-er this year.

- Camp registration will be limited to create the ability to social distance. Due to this change we will not be hosting "Rookie Camp" this year. Only campers with a 4-H age 9-12 will be qualified to participate in camp in 2021. Camp is also limited to 2021 enrolled 4-Hers.
- Masks must be worn at all times. (indoor and outdoor) unless youth are swimming, eating, or sleeping. We recommend campers bring at least 2 masks per day.
- No youth who are exhibiting any signs of illness will participate in camp. There will be a refund policy in place in case your child is unable to attend camp due to illness.
- If your child becomes ill at camp they must be picked up within 6 hours of exhibiting symptoms. Please be sure that if you are sending your child to camp--you have a plan in place to quickly pick up your child if they exhibit symptoms of illness. A prorated refund will be available if your child is sent home early due to illness.

After a crazy 2020-we are excited to fully embrace this year's theme of "Let's Glow Crazy" and Glow with our Oz-Some campers!


Delano 4-H Club Age: 17

We meet once a month for 3 hours on a weekend. Some different techniques we have learned are applique, paper piecing, basic quilting blocks, quilt as you go, and more. We have made pumpkins, Christmas trees, snowmen, and Easter bunnies. February's project was paper piecing hearts. For this project I found a great pattern but to buy a pattern for each 4-H'er would be out of the budget. I contacted Faith Wellman, who is the designer of the pattern, and she sent us 12 patterns for the 4-H'ers free! She also gave me permission to teach over zoom.

Twelve 4-H'ers learned paper piecing over zoom and then some of them went on to teach others. One 4-H'er taught her younger brother and sister. One other 4-H'er taught her grandma and they made lots of hearts together. It is awesome that these sewers are passing on what they learn!

One thing that has made putting these workshops together easier is a local quilt shop called Faithful Remnants- 323 S. Hydraulic, Wichita KS. This store offers a variety of discounts to 4-H members.

Each month we love getting together, sharing, sewing, and encouraging each other. Sewers are the best people. We have made so many new friends through fiber arts. LIVESTOCK UPDATE

Horse Identification and Horseless Horse Certificates

All Horse Identification Certificates and Horseless Horse Certificates are due to the Extension office by 5 p.m. on Friday, **April 30** because May 1 falls on a Saturday this year. Appropriate forms can be found at <u>https://www.sedgwick.k-state.edu/4-h-youth/project-resources/horse.html</u>

**Please note that the Horse ID Certificate was updated last year and this form (dated January 2020) must be used. Also posted on the website above is an example of a correctly filled out Horse ID Certificate; it must only be one page (front and back).

4-H Horse Snaffle Bit Project Nominations - Horse snaffle bit project nominations are also due to the Extension office by 5 p.m. on Friday, **April 30** since May 1 falls on a Saturday this year.

Along with the nomination, a Horse Identification Certificate and a \$10 fee must be submitted.

KS Junior Livestock Show & KS State Fair Livestock Nominations

4-H members planning on showing their animals at the Kansas Junior Livestock Show (KJLS) and/or the Kansas State Fair must submit nominations to the Youth Livestock office. Market Beef nominations are due by May 1. **NOTE: Please plan ahead as May 1 is a Saturday this year, so all forms will need to be signed no later than Friday, April 30. Commercial Heifer, Swine, Sheep, and Meat Goat nominations are due by June 15. Information pertaining to the Kansas Livestock Nominations can be found at <u>www.YouthLivestock.ksu.edu</u>

Horse Level Testing

The Level 1 Achievement test is required for all youth to participate in District and State Horse Shows. Online/video levels testing will be accepted again this year. State 4-H Horse Judging Contest

The State 4-H Horse Judging Contest has been rescheduled to Friday, April 23rd in Hutchinson at the Kansas State Fairgrounds. The contest will consist of both Intermediate and Senior 4-H Division spread out in both Expo I and II. Division entries will be limited based on first come first serve. Due to the limitation, registration opening will be repeatedly publicized in advance. Further details, including contest times, will be released soon.

YQCA CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENT - AS A REMINDER, YQCA CERTIFICATION IS REQUIRED TO PARTICIPATE AT KJLS AND AT THE KANSAS STATE FAIR.

It will also be required for 7-year-olds exhibiting at KJLS this year. The YQCA Board has provided an option for Kansas 7-year-olds to become officially certified. The state communication is that they must attend an instructor-led class with a parent/legal guardian. However, Sedgwick County will not be offering in person training this year-as I have not been trained to conduct this program at this time. Below is the certification process our county will follow for 7 year old certifications:

- 7-year-olds have permission to take the currently available 8-year-old web-based course through the YQCA website as an online option.
- They will register and complete the class, like any other web-based course and receive a certificate.
- They will not be able to re-certify online next year when they are a true 8-year-old, until their current certification expires.

If they chose to do the class online as an 8-year-old next year, tha't fine, they'll just have to wait until their 2021 certificate expires. The system will try to "help them out" and not let them re-enroll in a class they've already taken.

* Example: If they complete the class on March 31 this year, they won't be able to re-certify until April 1, 2022. At that point, the system will let then in and select the 8-year-old course.

- To clarify-your 7 year old will take the age 8 class twice (This year while they are 7and next year when they are 8). They should NOT continue taking the course for the next age up in the future. We don't want them to be off track for their entire show career.
- If you have any questions or would like further clarification, don't hesitate to give me a call and we'll discuss it.
