Some things you will learn to do:

- Learn the difference between a rock and a fossil
- Collect, clean, identify and label rocks, minerals and fossils found in Kansas
- Use different tests to identify minerals by hardness and color
- Find out what rock types occur in Kansas
- Do lots of hands-on-learning from map reading to specimen ID
- Learn to identify fossils
- Learn to display and evaluate geology exhibits.
- Read a topographical map
- Learn about geology careers.

Special event – Kansas Geology Field Trip

This state wide event is usually held the second week in June (Friday thru Sunday) and is in 2 different locations in the state. Members/families can attend the location of their choice. Registration is usually due in May.

Each year the group plans two or three county wide day field trips with one being an overnight trip.
