Mission

The purpose of the Sedgwick County Extension Master Gardener Volunteer Program is to provide opportunities for gardening enthusiasts to expand their knowledge of horticulture and to actively share that knowledge with the community.

Participation Guidelines

- Be a resident of Sedgwick County, have a high school diploma or equivalent, possess a broad interest in horticulture, and be interested in working with and teaching others.
- Support the objectives of the K-State Research & Extension - Sedgwick County horticulture department and the Extension Master Gardener Volunteer Program.
- Electronic communication is critical and is the primary form of communication. It is preferred that you have an email address and the ability to utilize successfully these technologies.
- Read and comprehend an extensive class handbook that is used as support materials for classroom sessions.
- Attend daytime (week-day) basic training sessions, completing make-up lessons in cases of excused absences.
- After completion of basic training sessions in 2021, complete 48 hours of volunteer work (including 12 hours on phone hotline) in approved projects by December 31, 2022, nine hours of advanced training sessions throughout the year and nine hours basic training in fall of 2022.
- Continued distinction as an Extension Master Gardener Volunteer in good standing requires completion of nine hours of advanced training sessions, nine hours of basic training sessions, and 48 volunteer hours each year.

Your Role as an Extension Master Gardener

Applications are due by **July 30, 2021** or **must be postmarked July 30, 2021**. Personal interviews will be conducted during August. Acceptance or denial letters will be mailed by August 27, 2021.

Class size is limited and participants are chosen according to gardening experience, volunteer availability and interest, and the needs of the Extension Master Gardener Volunteer Program.

I wish to become a Sedgwick County Extension Master Gardener Volunteer Program trainee and will attend the training sessions that begin on Thursday, September 2, 2021 and continue each Thursday from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. through December 16, 2021. I understand the exact schedule will be finalized in August. All sessions will be held at the Sedgwick County Extension Education Center located at 7001 W. 21st St. North, in 4-H Hall, or virtually, or a combination of both depending on COVID restrictions.

I understand that if I am accepted into the program, I am entering into a commitment to return a minimum of 48 volunteer hours to the Horticulture and/or Extension Master Gardener Volunteer Program by December 31, 2022. I further understand that continued distinction as an *active* Extension Master Gardener Volunteer requires annual completion of 48 volunteer hours, nine hours of basic training sessions and nine hours of advanced training.

In exchange for volunteer hours, Extension Master Gardener Volunteers receive at least 48 hours of Horticultural training provided by K-State Research & Extension Specialists and County Extension Agents and recognized horticultural leaders in the community.

Extension Master Gardener Volunteers are expected to provide recommendations to the public based on K-State research-based information and to provide educational program assistance in support of the Sedgwick county extension education program. Extension Master Gardener Volunteers may not participate in the K-State Research & Extension Master Gardener Volunteer Program for personal financial gain or for commercial recommendations or endorsements.

Master Gardener Volunteers operate under the supervision of a trained extension professional responsible for monitoring their performance and the progress of their continuing education.

Individuals accepted into the Master Gardener Volunteer Program may be required to undergo a background check. All information is strictly confidential.
